One famous song that hit the charts in the 80's was "Reaching Out". A love song sung by Gary Valenciano depicts how a lover is reaching out unconditionally to his / her beloved "abut-abot". The songs goes: "What must i do to make you understand, you mean everything to me.

And I'l there, I'll be there if you need me. Reaching out to you, do you feel it too, loving you is all i wanna do".

For the past 10 years, Arnold Janssen Kalinga Center has embraced the vision-mission of recreating and empowering lives of our dear sisters and brothers living in the streets. "Abut-abot" is our desire to stretch our hands and hearts to our dear Homeless. Abut-abot means welcoming them with open arms and smiles, abut-abot is about offering them a temporary yet cozy waiting area, clean and refreshing showers, abut-abot is about jumping into a sumptuous unlimited hot meal and sinangdomeng rice. Abut-abot is receiving blessing after blessing from someone who truly cares even when we are underserving of it.

Similarly, our saintly Founder St. Arnold Janssen had his own experience of "abut-abot"

150 years ago. Relying solely from the kindness of others, St.Arnold built the first house of the Society of the Divine Word—through a dowry offered by a candidate to the religious life. This graciousness from heaven continued the seed of mission to the very mission of Arnold Janssen Kalinga Center. As we welcome at least 300 homeless 4 x a week we rely on the benevolence of the young and old, rich and poor alike to provide the dignified and holistic care as part of our unique manner of reaching out to those living in the fringes of our society.

"Abut-abot" aside from meaning "reaching out" also denotes over-flowing. As we celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Arnold Janssen Kalinga Center, our chosen theme is:

"Mula sa kapuspusan ng kanyang kagandahang-loob, tumanggap tayong lahat ng abut-abot na kagandahang-loob ng pagkalinga at paghilom." (Juan 1:16)


